**Subject:** Recommended Autism Training and Continued Education

As part of the 2025 General Assembly Session and enactment of Virginia Code § 54.1-2409.6 the Department of Health Professions recommends that all licensed healthcare providers pursue continued education and training in working with children on the autism spectrum.

These children often face unique challenges in healthcare settings, including sensory sensitivities, communication barriers, and anxiety related to unfamiliar environments. As healthcare professionals, your ability to recognize, understand, and accommodate these needs can significantly improve health outcomes and patient experiences.

We recommend the following resources and training opportunities:

- **Autism Society of Central Virginia** offers a free Introduction to Autism Overview Training tailored for Virginia-licensed healthcare professionals. This training focuses on communication strategies and sensory-friendly practices, including characteristics of autism in children.
