## FEMALE OFFENDERS

The Greenbrier Birthing Center MINT Program is overseen by the Baltimore Residential Reentry Office. For more information on referrals, please contact (304) 653-4882 Monday to Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

The MINT program is a residential reentry center-based program that promotes bonding and parenting skills for low-risk female offenders who are pregnant. Women are eligible to enter the program if they are in their last three months of pregnancy, have less than five years remaining to serve on their sentence, and are eligible for furlough. The decision to refer an offender to the MINT program is at the discretion of the offender's unit team if incarcerated, or probation officer if on supervision.

Abortion: BOP funds are used to pay for abortion services only when the life of the mother would be endangered if the fetus is carried to term or in the case of rape. In all other cases, non-BOP funds must be obtained to pay for an abortion.

# Evidence-Based Recidivism Reduction (EBRR) Programs

\* **Bureau Rehabilitation and Values Enhancement (BRAVE) Program** – a cognitive-behavioral, residential treatment program for young males serving 1st sentence, to create a smoother adjustment to prison.

\* **Challenge Program** – a program for male inmates in Penitentiary (High Security) facilities. Treats those with substance abuse and/or mental illness disorders (psychotic, mood, anxiety, or personality).

**Federal Prison Industries Program (UNICOR)** is designed to protect society and reduce crime by preparing inmates for successful reentry through job training.

**Life Connections Program** – a residential faith-based program, not religion specific.

\* **Mental Health Step Down Program** – a program for inmates who do not require inpatient treatment but lack the skills to function in a general population prison setting.

**Post-Secondary Education** College level classes are provided by credentialed instructors from the community who deliver coursework leading to either the Associates or bachelor's degree.

\* **Residential Drug Abuse Program (RDAP)** – an intensive treatment program where offenders experience living in a pro-social community.

**Resolve Program** – a program for those with a mental health diagnosis related to trauma.

**Sex Offender Treatment Program: Nonresidential, (SOTP-NR)** – a program for low- to moderate-risk first-time sex offenders with a single history of an Internet sex crime. The BOP Sexual Offender Treatment and Management Program

\* **Sex Offender Treatment Program: Residential (SOTP-R)** – a program for high-risk sex offenders with a history of multiple sex crimes. The BOP Sexual Offender Treatment and Management Program

\* **Skills Program** – a program for inmates with intellectual disabilities, neurological deficits, and social deficiencies (i.e., Autistic).

\* **Steps Toward Emotional Growth and Awareness (STAGES) Program** – a program for those with a serious mental illness and/or a borderline personality disorder.

**Assert Yourself for Female Offenders** In this program, women learn to be assertive while respecting the boundaries of others.

\* **Female Integrated Treatment (FIT)\* Foundation** For female inmates with substance use, trauma (PTSD), and other mental illnesses.

**Foundation Program** was designed to help women chart a healthy path for themselves during their time incarcerated
